














Child Victim Witness Support Program

Program d'aide aux enfants victimes et témoins



About the Program

The court process can be a confusing and frightening experience for a child or youth. Every child or youth has the right to be thoroughly prepared for his/her role as a witness in court.

The Child Victim Witness Support Program (CVWSP) offers a range of services to assist children, youth and their caregivers in preparation for a court appearance. Any child or youth subpoenaed to court is eligible for service from the program.



Individual court preparation for children and youth (3-17 years), and their caregivers;



Court Accompaniment for child and youth witnesses; and



Post court follow-up for children, youth and their caregivers.

All referrals are made by the Victim Witness Assistance Program

Court Preparation

During individual sessions, Child Witness Advocates will:



Discuss fears, concerns and questions about going to court:



Discuss strategies to mitigate these fears and concerns;



Provide information and answer questions about the criminal justice system; and



Explain the court process and everybody's role in it.



Facilitate and attend meetings between the witness and the Crown Attorney.

Child Victim Witness Support Program staff have flexible schedules to accommodate families' needs.

Court Accompaniment



Child Witness Advocates can attend court with children or youth, if requested.



Child Witness Advocates can act as Designated Support Person for child or youth witnesses.

Post-Court Support



Debrief meetings following court;



Understanding the judge's decision and what happens after court;



Assistance completing Victim Impact Statements; and



Referrals to other services/agencies, if required.







PROVINCIAL INTERNET CHILD EXPLOITATION STRATEGY







The CYAC Youth Ambassador Program is designed to engage and empower survivors of abuse by incorporating their voices in the creation, facilitation, and evaluation of our programs, procedures, and policies. By becoming Youth Ambassadors, survivors will not only contribute to shaping CYAC's initiatives but will also emerge as community leaders advocating for issues important to young people.

Findings from a report by the Canadian Centre for Child Protection highlight the transformative effects of public advocacy for survivors of child sexual abuse, including increased self-esteem, confidence, and quality of life. This program aims to replicate these positive outcomes by training Youth Ambassadors to represent CYAC at community events, co-facilitate youth groups, provide strategic input, and attend quarterly meetings.
